This winter school brings together aspirants, scholars and authors to explore and examine the principle ideas and debates at the intersection of Indian ethics and aesthetics. The interplay between ethics and aesthetics – between the normative and the narrative – defines the intellectual history and culture of the Indian subcontinent. Just as artistic and literary works describe and prescribe social and moral standards, the latter are subjected to literary evaluations based on the ethical paradigms of the prevailing times. We invite participants to reflect on the nature and experience of art, while also delving into the relations between the social, political and artistic spheres.

- Indian classics: Sanskrit and Tamil poetics
- Art and architecture: aesthetics of visual culture
- Indigenous literary traditions

- Premodern literatures: Bhakti and Siddha traditions
- Modern Indian literary traditions and frameworks of critique
